ASK THE EXPERTS

This quarter **BB** has asked the “Experts” their opinions on Jumps over Partner’s 1NT. Responses came in from Ewa Zwicky and Mike Ainsley.

EZ: Since I use the four suit transfer system, I do not need the jump in one of the minors to indicate some type of hand with 6 of a minor. Instead, I use 3C to show a weak hand with 5-5 in the minors and 3D to show the game going hand with 5-5 in the minors. By default this shows a hand with a singleton or a void, which is good information for the NT opener. When, as responder, I bid 3C partner may pass or bid 3D if he prefers that suit.

If I respond 3D to partner’s 1NT, I’m happy to accept game in either minor or in 3NT, as partner has received a description of my distribution and point count, and has subsequently decided on the best contract.

The response of 3H or 3S is used in many ways. When it’s used to show a slammish hand, I feel it’s a wasted bid as there are many other ways available to us to show slam interest. Players also use this bid to show a singleton in that suit, but in that case, what opposition is hearing is that that declarer has a maximum of 5 cards in that suit to play with, so let’s attack this suit. For me 3H in response to partner’s 1NT shows a hand with 1S, 3H, and 5-4 in the minors. The downside of this bid is that, should opener decide that the best course is to play the hand in a moysian fit, then the weaker hand would end up as declarer. Nothing is perfect.

This bid does not come up often, but when it does it feels really good to have it your tool box.

MA: As for my use of 3 clubs, diamonds, hearts and spades in response to 1NT they vary with different partnerships.

Currently, I am using 3 clubs as Puppet Stayman, 3 diamonds as a strong 5- 5 in the minors. 3 hearts as a splinter in hearts with 3 spades and 5 - 4 in the minors, and 3 spades as a splinter in spades with 3 hearts and again 5 - 4 in the minors, in one of my partnerships.

If I was a novice I would not recommend this usage. I would recommend instead using 3 clubs and 3 diamonds as invitational to 3NT, 7 or 8 HCP, and a good suit(partner would bid 3 NT with honour 3rd and pass otherwise) and 3 hearts and 3 spades as a slam try with a good 6 card major. Sometimes keeping things simple is best until you have a good grasp on the conventions you feel you have them all mastered.

NO MORE LOST SLEEP IN DUNCAN!

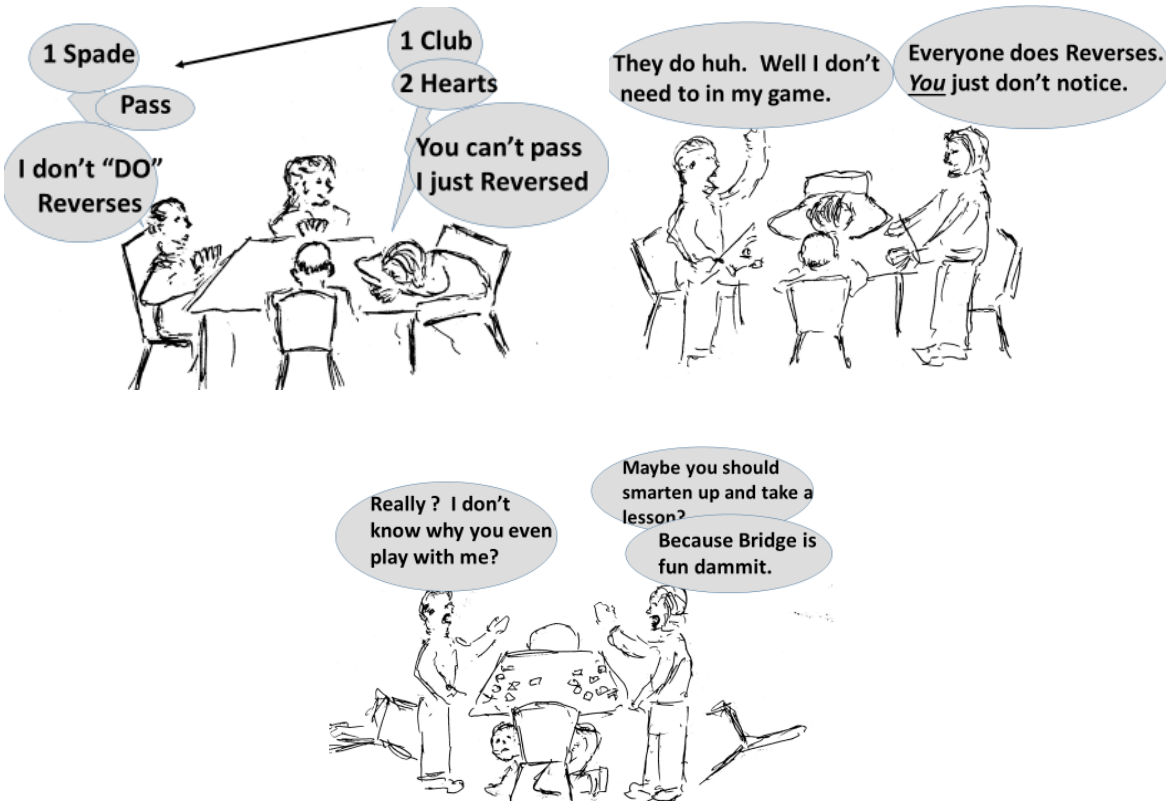
The Duncan Sectional has changed weekends, so it will no longer be on "clock change" weekend. The new dates for 2019 are February 22-24.

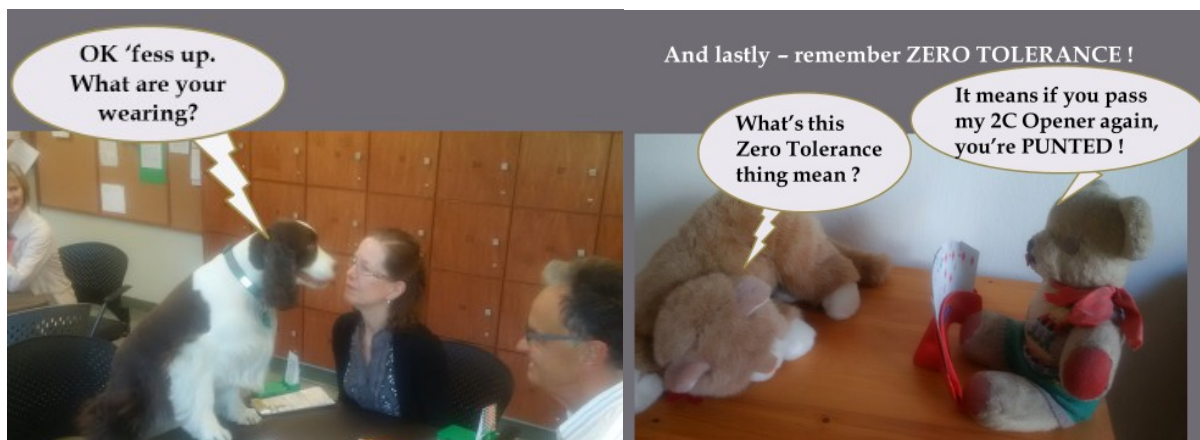
